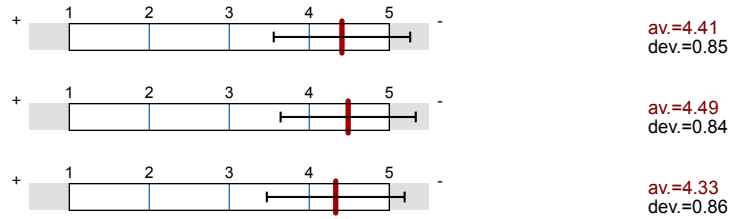

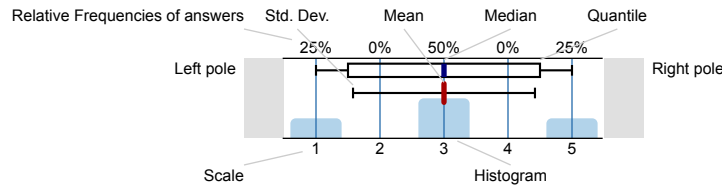

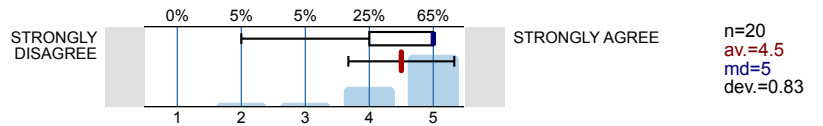

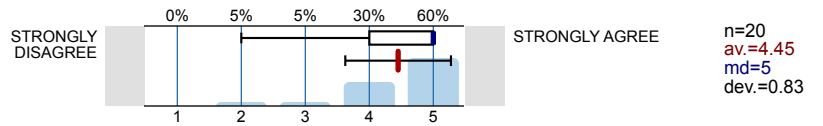
2.1) Instructor created an environment that was conducive to learning.



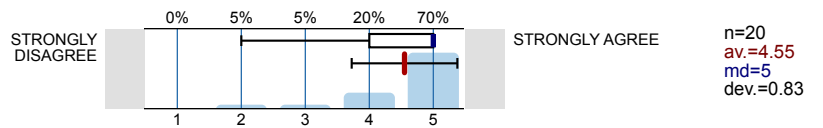
2.2) Instructor gave clear explanations.



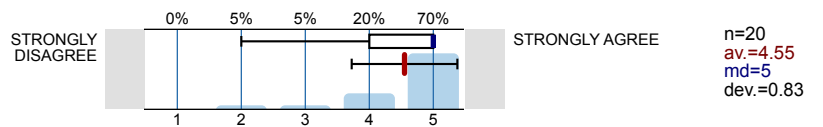
2.3) Instructor used helpful examples and illustrations.



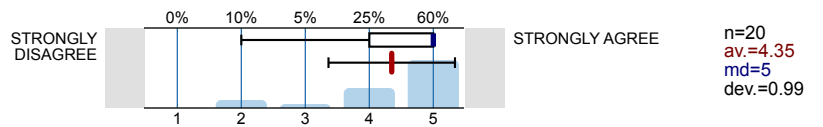
2.4) Instructor consistently followed grading criteria.



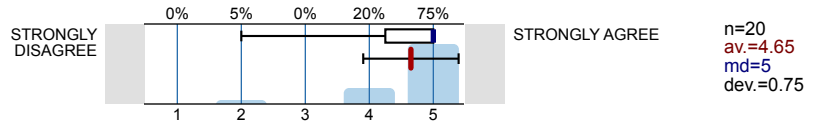
2.5) Instructor provided useful feedback.



2.6) Instructor provided timely feedback.

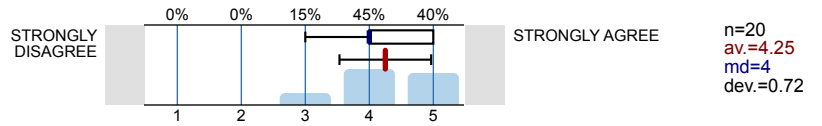

5. Open Response

5.1) Please comment on what the the instructor did that was most effective and/or on areas for improvement.

- He gave very clear feedback to how I could improve upon my writing.
- He was open minded and understanding. He also made this class decently fun (or as much as it could be).
I did not, however, like the setup of the class. I didn't understand the content of the first half of the class until the end. I would suggest that he flip the assignments.
- I really liked Mr. V. A lot of the exercises we did in class were helpful and he always made sure we understood what we were doing, even if he had to explain it multiple times. He also provided exceptional feedback on all of our work in a timely manner, and, when I say exceptional, I mean exceptional. He clearly took a lot of time to read everything we wrote and commented on things throughout the papers. At the end, he would write a blurb that was usually over a page detailing what he thought we did well and what he thought we could have improved on. Additionally, I really liked the way he graded. He uses this method called the grading contract which makes it easy to know where you stand in the class and provides a level playing field for everyone.
- I really liked how he was so prompt in replying to emails and was always available to answer any and all questions. His feed back to the projects was extremely helpful :)
- I thought the material was really educational and relative to where my peers and myself are during this time in our lives professionally.
- IWAs were effective and I believe they helped a lot with my understanding of the subject. However variability in the peer reviews would have been preferred.
- Mr. Vetter did a good job explaining what he wanted us to get out of the course and the individual assignments. He seemed excited to teach us and encouraged participation. While some of the readings weren't as helpful as others, most of the assignments were good tools in teaching the class how to write in a professional setting. I found this class to be a very helpful english course, allowing us to prepare for our future and providing us with new ways to write outside of an educational setting.
- Mr. Vetter was always very helpful and available inside and outside class time. He challenged everyone with the course work. I really enjoyed the course which is surprising because I don't typically enjoy english.
